

According to the US Department of Agriculture (USDA), the average cost of raising a child born in 2015 until age 18 for a middle-income family (earning between $\$ 59,200$ and $\$ 107,400$ a year) in the US is approximately $\$ 233,610$, according to the latest annual "Cost of Raising a Child" report. That equates to roughly \$12,980 \$14,970 per child per year for a two-parent family with median income.

The annual cost can vary based on factors such as the child's age, the number of children in the family and the family's income and location. Families earning less than $\$ 59,200$ per year can expect to spend $\mathbf{\$ 1 7 6 , 5 5 0}$ on a child from birth to age 18, which equates to $\$ 9,808$ per year per child. Families earning more than $\$ 107,400$ per year can expect to spend $\mathbf{\$ 4 0 7 , 8 2 0}$ from birth to age 18 , which equates to \$22,657 per year per child.
