## How Do Teenagers Spend Their Money?

Teens are spending most of their money on food. Food accounts for $23 \%$ of teen spending, followed by clothing (20\%), accessories (10\%), video games (8\%), cars (8\%), electronics ( $8 \%$ ), and shoes ( $7 \%$ ). The rest is spent on music, movies and events.

## How Do Teenage Parents Spend Their Money?

As reported by babycenter.com, the average cost of caring for a child in its first year of life is $\$ 10,158$. The cost of diapers, formula, baby wipes, clothing and housing add up quickly, which is why pregnant teens often rely on their parents for help. The average monthly expenses for teenage parents are as follows:

If you have health insurance, prenatal visits and any diagnostic tests (such as ultrasounds) will likely be covered. They are generally considered "preventive" care. If you don't have health insurance, the average cost of prenatal care is about $\$ 2,000$.

Birthing expenses with no complications can range from \$9,000-\$25,000 without health insurance and $\$ 500$ to $\$ 3,000$ with health insurance.
